
Free- Greenwaste Dumpster Days Sat. Jan 20 9-4 (or till full)

The County Transportation Commission will present to us their draft "Greater Placerville Wildfire Evacuation Preparedness Plan" and explain how to provide feedback. Learn how they do their evacuation scenario modeling/ hear about recommended infrastructure improvements/ ask questions of Commission staff.

# What do I do with all the slash after creating defensible space??

There are many *Free* options:



Make **small piles well separated from each othe**r, left to slowly decompose, enriching the soil and providing wildlife habitat. Up to 2 feet high and 10 feet across can work. Be sure such piles are at least 100 ft from structures.

Have the material **chipped onsite for free**, thru the County Fire Safe Council's grant-supported program. <u>Details and Sign up here</u>.





Bring it to the free green waste dumpster at Oak Hill Fire Station Sat. Jan 20 and Sat. May 11 (see first page for details). Available 9-4, or till full, unlimited amt. per household.

Add 5 **combustible bags of plant material** next to your green waste bin, or, use your EDD coupon to dispose of 30 bags at once, if you call ahead (watch expiration dates). Large paper bags for



this can be bought at hardware stores. Details

And of course, there's always burning, though the smoke can be bothersome to you or others.Get a <u>permit</u> **and** check if a <u>burn day</u>.



### **Roadside and Hazardous Fuel Reduction grant work** *moving ahead!*

A lot of the "behind the scenes" work has been getting done for the CALFIRE grant that was received by the Oak Hill Area Fire Safe Council and 5 other Councils. The Resource Conservation District (RCD) and Fire Safe Council representatives have been working very hard to complete delineation of where hazardous fuel reduction will be made, getting the environmental studies completed and getting "Right of Entry" agreements from land owners.

The RCD has now hired various contractors (such as the professional foresters, archaeological experts and others) and is in the process of hiring the company that will do the actual "on the ground" work. Hopefully we will start seeing some of the improvements along Oak Hill Rd, Big Oak Rd and Pleasant Valley Rd starting in Spring 2024.
